CGS PROGRAM COURSES APPLICABLE TO THE WS/CGS MAJORS AND MINORS:

CRITICAL GENDER STUDIES 100 CONCEPTUALIZING GENDER/THEORY AND METHODS VERITY SMITH

This course will compare the uses of gender as a category across academic disciplines in the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences, with particular attention to research methodologies. Methods surveyed will include liberal feminist, radical feminist, ecofeminist, socialist, psychoanalytic, existentialist, postmodernist, queer theoretic, and postcolonial approaches to theorizing gender. We will also take up the questions of the enforcement and subversion of gender normativity; contemporary masculinity studies; the importance of race and sexuality in theorizing gender; and the role and meaning of the category of "experience" in critical gender theory.

CRITICAL GENDER STUDIES 102 TOPICS: WOMEN AND SPORT JUDITH SWEET

(SECTION ID 389146)

This course is designed to examine the history of women in sport and the changes that have taken place since the passage of TITLE IX in 1972. Topics will explore the evolution of women in sport from a historical, social, psychological, political and legal perspective.

CRITICAL GENDER STUDIES 102 TOPICS: RACE/GENDER/SCIENCE/TECHNOLOGY LEIGH STAR
(SECTION ID 389147)

This course examines the impact of gender on the production and use of science and technology. Among the areas covered are: sexism and racism in biotechnology, reproductive technology; biological determinism; information technology and access; technology in the workplace; the careers and working conditions of scientists, engineers and technicians; invisible work; eugenics; and the politics of museums. We will also discuss methodological issues in the conduct of science, and ethics in both science and technology.

CRITICAL GENDER STUDIES 190 HONORS SEMINAR STAFF

Interdisciplinary readings in feminist theory and research methodology to prepare students for writing an honors thesis. Open to critical gender studies majors who have been admitted to Critical Gender Studies Honors Program. Prerequisites: admission to Critical Gender Studies Honors Program and department stamp required.

CRITICAL GENDER STUDIES 196A HONORS RESEARCH STAFF

A program of independent study providing candidates for critical gender studies honors to develop, in consultation with an adviser, a preliminary proposal for the honors thesis. An IP grade will be awarded at the end of this quarter. A final grade for both quarters will be given upon completion of Critical Gender Studies 196B. Prerequisites: consent of instructor and department stamp required.
