This course aims to investigate and compare social movements, from the late 20th century to the present, that have negotiated, contested, and/or changed the nature of ideas and institutions related to gender and sexuality. We will attempt to define what a social movement is, how it mobilizes, what makes it successful, and to understand its short and long-term results. Course readings will address the theory and practice of social activism and its relationship to gender by drawing on a wide range of literature and visual media on such topics as: feminism and anti-feminism; race and ethnicity; AIDS, reproductive rights, and health and environmental activism; lesbian, gay, bi-sexual and transgendered movements; and, generally, movements focused on social justice, human rights, and peace. The scope of the course will be comparative, interdisciplinary, and set in a global context.
