Critical Gender Studies 2B "Introduction to Critical Gender Studies/ Gender and Institutions: Gender and the Media"

This course will consider how various media both reflect and shape gender and sexuality as they intersect with other social determinants such as class, race, ethnicity, nationality, and geopolitical location. Most of our attention will be devoted to the analysis of representations of heteronormative and other masculinities and femininities. We will see how these representations change and proliferate in the course of the 20th century in media ranging from advertising, photojournalism, and film to broadcast and cable television, television news, and the internet. Our main concern will be visual media, but we will also consider other forms, including literature and music. Most of the course material will focus on the United States and will address questions of multiculturalism. However, we will also read essays dealing with gender and the media in some other national contexts (e.g. France, India) to see how the media function there and also how other nations deal with the power and ubiquity of the US media.

Critical Gender Studies 102 "Topics: Introduction to Gender and Sexuality"

This course provides an introduction to the interdisciplinary examination of human, and especially gay and lesbian, sexual and erotic desires, orientations, and identities. We will study how desires are constructed, how they vary and remain the same in different places and times, and how they interact with other social and cultural phenomena such as government; family; popular culture; scientific inquiry; and, especially, race, gender, and class.

"Gender Equality and the Law"

This course will explore the legal treatment of discrimination based on sex and gender, including equal protection doctrine and statutory law such as Title VII. Topics include the meaning of gender and sex equality in such areas as military service, sexual harassment, discrimination based on pregnancy and other current legal issues.

Critical Gender Studies 109A "Gender, Science, Technology"

This course examines the impact of gender and racialized gender on the production and uses of science, technology and medicine. Issues include (but are not limited to): racism, genetics and biotechnology, biological determinism, eugenics, plagiarism and invisible work, information technologies and access, and the politics of museum displays. We also examine medical ethics, the impact of the women's health movement, and specific cases such as Sickle-cell and Tay-Sachs diseases, childbirth, and mental health.
