The course will introduce the concept of gender as a category of analysis for understanding relationships of power. It will focus on how different groups have mobilized around claims about gender roles and identities. Case studies of movements contesting rights and representation will

be drawn from comparative global contexts: possible subjects are civil rights, men's movements, antiracist feminism, non-feminist women's movements, AIDS activism, transgenderism, immigrant rights, non-western feminism and the labor movement.

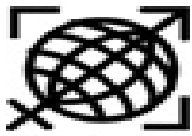
