This course will consider the construction and transfiguration of sexual and gender identities in relation to ethnicity, culture, and geopolitical location in various places and in different historical periods. Examples include colonial North America, 19th-century Britain, and the early 20th-century Caribbean as well as the contemporary societies in the US, Europe, the Middle East, Africa, and East Asia. Students will read theoretical and critical essays and will also analyze texts and cultural practices such as literature, film, and uses of the internet. Course work will include a brief presentation on one of the readings (10%); two 7-8 page papers (30% each), and a final exam to be administered during the last class meeting (30%).

This course will compare the uses of gender as a category of analysis across academic disciplines in the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences with particular attention to research methodologies. Students will complete a research project that demonstrates their ability to apply cross-disciplinary methods to the study of gender in order to show how the complexities of gender can only be understood at the intersection of multiple forms of knowledge production.
